

## What can I expect if my child has to return to remote learning? An overview for parents

### What happens if my child has to self-isolate whilst their bubble remains open?



Notify the school that your child has started a period of self-isolation as soon as possible. This might be because you are shielding / live with someone who is shielding, have been informed that you have been in contact with a positive COVID-19 case or someone in your household has symptoms and you are awaiting test results.




By 8 a.m. on the morning of **day 2** of your child's absence, you will receive work via email.

This should take the form of:

- 1 x English activity
- 1 x maths activity
- 1 x reading activity
- 1 x curriculum lesson

As much as possible, your child's teacher will adapt and send work that matches what the class will be doing in school. This should allow your child to pick up in class in the same place as their peers upon their return.



Work will continue to be sent – usually on a day-to-day basis – until your child returns to school.  
Please keep us informed of any changes in your situation and your expected return date.



Work completed whilst in self-isolation can be sent into school when your child returns. Your child's teacher will review the work they have completed then.



### What happens if my child's bubble or the school is closed?

If Public Health England require the closure of a bubble or the wider closure of the school, your child will be sent home with a paper home learning pack of activities for the first two days of closure.

This paper home learning pack will also include your child's personal log-in details to the learning platform, Seesaw.



Seesaw allows staff to post work, view a child's uploaded and completed work and provide some feedback to your child.

By 8 a.m. on **day 3** of closure, work appropriate for your child will be posted to their Seesaw account. This may include videos explaining the work made either by your child's teacher or another staff member in their year group team.

A day's menu will normally include:


- 1 x English activity
- 1 x maths activity
- 1 x reading activity (or phonics for children in EYFS or KS1)

Over the course of the week, your child will also receive 2 x curriculum lessons (this could be history, art, geography etc.) and 1 x science lesson).

As much as possible, we will try and continue the lessons that would have been covered in school.  
Work will be posted **daily**.



We understand that family life can be busy and that you may not be keeping normal school hours. Make the times that your child sits down to learn fit with your family routine.  
Completed work should be uploaded to Seesaw for your teacher to see! We can give you feedback too.



If you have any difficulties with using the platform, let us know as soon as possible. Class teachers will be reviewing all work completed and contacting families if we can see that accounts have not been accessed.

Teachers can be contacted via Seesaw for support as to how to complete an activity or any work related concerns. We will respond to these messages within two school days. Any other queries should be directed to the school office as normal.
